WELCOME

Tomorrow is Earth Day and so in today's service we give thanks to God for all of creation in its glorious abundance through which we are sustained and have life. The image of the good shepherd in today's



readings shows us how the risen Christ brings us to life. It is the relationship between the shepherd and the sheep, one of mutual knowledge and love, that gives the shepherd authority. The shepherd's willingness to lay down his life for the sheep shows his love. First John illustrates what it means to lay down our lives for one another by the example of sharing our wealth with any sibling in need. Let us take a moment, as we listen to the prelude, to prepare our hearts and minds to receive the abundant wealth God bestows on us through God's Service this very morning.

THANKSGIVING FOR BAPTISM

Look! Here is water! What is to prevent us from giving thanks for baptism?

Water may be poured into the font, a bowl, or a pool.

Here is water.
Rushing water. Surging water.
Pounding, crashing surf of water.
Foaming waters to wash us clean,
to scrub away the guilt, the burden that clings,
to wipe away the grime of archived fear.
Blessed be water.
We give you thanks, Creator God,
for sea and ocean, tides and waves.
Here is water.
Tumbling water. Streaming water.
Free-flowing-shower-of-grace water.
Bubbling fount to soothe our hearts,
balm for the scars of angry division,
salve for the wounds of ignorant pride.

Blessed be water. We give you thanks, creative Word, for rain and snow, storm and mist.

Here is water. Clear water. Cool water. Quench-the-thirst-of-our-soul water. Still waters to restore our spirits, source of hope, refreshment for the journey toward the fold, sparkling with the promise of new life. Blessed be water.

We give you thanks, creating Spirit, for stream and pool, spring and lake.

Children and others may be invited to play, splash, wade in or otherwise interact with the water.

The leader or assisting minister might use an evergreen bough to sprinkle water over the assembly as these words are shared.

Here is water, through which God created and continues to create. In the beginning, weaving with the Breath of life every living being; throughout history, a gateway for divine deliverance; in every moment, re-membering the mystery of life, bonding all of creation as one.

We give you thanks, blessed Creator, for the gift of life, for this water without which life would cease, for the gift of baptism, through which these waters birth us again into your promise of newness, wholeness, and oneness. Blessed be Creator God, creative ? Word, creating Spirit. Blessed be each soul here and not here, one people, one with all that is. Blessed be this water that births us, renews us, and welcomes us home. **Amen.**

GATHERING SONG Crashing Waters at Creation (ELW 455)

- 1 Crashing waters at creation, ordered by the Spirit's breath, first to witness day's beginning from the brightness of night's death.

CHILDREN'S MESSAGE

FIRST READING: Acts 4:5-12

Peter and John had been arrested the previous day because they were proclaiming the news of the resurrection to the people. In today's reading, Peter is filled with the Holy Spirit so that he can proclaim salvation in Jesus' name to the religious authorities.

⁵The next day [the] rulers, elders, and scribes assembled in Jerusalem, ⁶with Annas the high priest, Caiaphas, John, and Alexander, and all who were of the high-priestly family. ⁷When they had made the prisoners stand in their midst, they inquired, "By what power or by what name did you do this?" ⁸Then Peter, filled with the Holy Spirit, said to them, "Rulers of the people and elders, ⁹if we are questioned today because of a good deed done to someone who was sick and are asked how this man has been healed, ¹⁰let it be known to all of you, and to all the people of Israel, that this man is standing before you in good health by the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, whom you crucified, whom God raised from the dead. ¹¹This Jesus is

'the stone that was rejected by you, the builders;

it has become the cornerstone.'

¹²There is salvation in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given among mortals by which we must be saved."

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SECOND READING: 1 John 3:16-24

Jesus' death on our behalf is the clearest demonstration of divine love. This is the very love we share with others, not just through our words but especially through our deeds. In sharing such love we fulfill God's commandments.

A reading from 1 John.

¹⁶We know love by this, that [Jesus Christ] laid down his life for us—and we ought to lay down our lives for one another. ¹⁷How does God's love abide in anyone who has the world's goods and sees a brother or sister in need and yet refuses help?

¹⁸Little children, let us love, not in word or speech, but in truth and action. ¹⁹And by this we will know that we are from the truth and will reassure our hearts before him ²⁰whenever our hearts condemn us; for God is greater than our hearts, and he knows everything. ²¹Beloved, if our hearts do not condemn us, we have boldness before God; ²²and we receive from him whatever we ask, because we obey his commandments and do what pleases him.

²³And this is his commandment, that we should believe in the name of his Son Jesus Christ and love one another, just as he has commanded us. ²⁴All who obey his commandments abide in him, and he abides in them. And by this we know that he abides in us, by the Spirit that he has given us.

Word of God, word of life. **Thanks be to God.**

GOSPEL: John 10:11-18

In language that recalls the twenty-third psalm, Jesus describes himself as the shepherd who cares for his sheep. He is willing to die for them, and he is able to overcome death for them.

The holy gospel according to John.

Glory to you, O Lord.

[Jesus said:] ¹¹"I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep. ¹²The hired hand, who is not the shepherd and does not own the sheep, sees the wolf coming and leaves the sheep and runs away—and the wolf snatches them and scatters them. ¹³The hired hand runs away because a hired hand does not care for the sheep. ¹⁴I am the good shepherd. I know my own and my own know me, ¹⁵just as the Father knows me and I know the Father. And I lay down my life for the sheep. ¹⁶I have other sheep that do not belong to this fold. I must bring them also, and they will listen to my voice. So there will be one flock, one shepherd. ¹⁷For this reason the Father loves me, because I lay down my life in order to take it up again. ¹⁸No one takes it from me, but I lay it down of my own accord. I have power to lay it down, and I have power to take it up again. I have received this command from my Father." The gospel of the Lord.

Upcoming Commemorations

Anselm, Bishop of Canterbury, died 1109

Sunday, April 21, 2024

This eleventh-century monk was one of the greatest theologians of the Middle Ages. He is remembered for emphasizing the maternal aspects of God, and for the theory that the Son of God became human in order to make the necessary payment for our sin.

Day of the Creation (Día de la Creación) (LLC)

Monday, April 22, 2024

This observance invites us to notice and give God thanks for the wonders of the created universe. As stewards of that creation, we are also challenged to be careful in our use of it.

Toyohiko Kagawa, renewer of society, died 1960

Tuesday, April 23, 2024

Born in Kobe, Japan, Kagawa was orphaned as a young child. Later, when he became Christian, he was disowned by the rest of his family. Wishing to bring Christian principles into society, he worked among poor people, established schools and hospitals, and worked for peace.

Mark, Evangelist

Thursday, April 25, 2024

He was not numbered among the twelve apostles, yet Mark was probably a member of the early church community. The gospel that bears his name is the shortest and most direct, and many scholars think it was the first to be written.

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
